


Before the intervention: The site of the Vienna Valley Terrace consisted of the subway tracks on one hand and a left-over space hidden behind billboards on the other side.



**Before the intervention:** Cramped in between the tracks and the billboards was a narrow footpath combined with a bicycle lane - a dangerous situation with a blind corner that frequently led to collisions.



After the intervention: The architects extended the public space by bridging over the subway and upgraded the urban network with new crossings over the Vienna River, reducing traffic areas and increasing the amount of public open space by including left-over spaces and transforming existing underutilized open spaces.



After the intervention: The Vienna Valley Terrace creates new, free, non-commercial public space and integrates footpaths and bicycle paths with the metro line.
