


The urban amphitheatre is a chain link of the Boulevard Ring

New life was given to the space when Strelka KB proposed a project to turn the site into a public area with an amphitheater, and to showcase the discovered section of the wall of Bely Gorod. The project was developed by Strelka KB in cooperation with Irene Djao Rakitine, a landscape architect based in London. The first architectural object of its kind in Moscow, the amphitheater descends meters below street level down to the well-preserved fragment of the Bely Gorod wall. Behind the 16th-century fortification is a concrete wall covered by Virginia creeper vines. The eco-friendly water permeable TerraWay paving system used at the site can absorb rainwater and allows it to quickly evaporate.
