

A+D: A fence, which opens up on some views of the château's remains, separates the park from ancient buildings currently under renovation, as well as with future archaeological excavations, without hindering the use of the park. Placed as a permanent exhibit on this fence, visitors are given an insight into the development on this part of the city from the Middle Ages to our days, and in particular during the Renaissance and under the regency of Count Pierre-Ernest de Mansfeld.
