**CITY CENTER PAVILION AND MAIN SQUARE**

First of all, the houses had to be demolished to create a direct connection with the town hall square and the deserted plots. The old barn was renovated to leave a historical trace in the middle of the city. By extending the axis created by the municipality's building, an architectural element is set up on one hand to structure the public space and on the other hand to organize some function needed in such a space.

In the continuation of the actual town hall's square, the entrance of the project is defined by the new pavilion and the renovated old barn.

The long building (70 meters) is creating a mineral square followed by a botanical garden, old Provencal plants and flowers are growing along the square.
