

Palma's City Walls Renovation: From Ses Voltes Bastion to Príncep's Bastion

From military zone to public space overlooking the Mediterranean. Palma's city walls were demolished at the end of the 19th century so that the city might expand (they would not have been demolished today). The city wall that has been renovated was saved from demolition because the city could not extend into the sea.


Since 1983, a restoration and conversion into public space (a pedestrian promenade) has been taken place with several phases. The Príncep's Bastion, started in 2009 and was completed in 2013.

An open stage and a bar protected by canopies and a new tunnel connecting with the sea-front park, in front of the monumental area of the Cathedral, the Almudaina Palace and the Episcopal Palace, established the character of future phases.
